CREDO

I am fortunate to have the opportunity to attend a CREDO 2 conference May 7-14 in Loranger, Louisiana. I attended my first CREDO conference in 2006, and found it both helpful and inspiring. CREDO is an eight-day conference that provides an opportunity to embrace

wellness and to prayerfully discern the direction of our vocation. The conference focuses on four areas:

Spiritual — offers a sacred space where we can reflect on our interior lives and our relationship with God.

Vocational — provides opportunities for reflection, discernment, and planning in the areas of calling, career, and work.

Health — encourages reflection on physical and emotional health and well-being, stewardship of the body, and development of a plan to address our individual health needs.

Financial — explores all aspects of personal financial management and encourages reflection on God-given resources and how best to use them in response to God's call.

Over the course of the conference we will hear presentations, meet in small discussion groups, and have individual consultations with faculty members in the four focus areas. We will also have plenty of time for reflection and prayer.

The Latin word "credo" can be translated as "I believe," but it also has a much deeper meaning, "I give my heart." The focus of CREDO 2 is on living with integrity in all aspects of life. We will spend the week exploring what it means to live a life that is congruent with our core values, beliefs and faith – a life that is whole and holy. So though part of the work is intellectual, it goes much deeper than that, inviting us to engage our hearts and souls in the process of taking stock of where we are in these four areas and where God is calling us to be.

The end result of this discernment and visioning process is to create a comprehensive rule of life. I still have quite a bit of work to do in preparation for the conference, but am looking forward to the week and to discovering what it will bring.

When the conference ends, as I will be only a few hours away from where my mother and brother live, I'll spend a few days relaxing and visiting with both of them.

WALKING THE WALK IN COMMUNITY — A HUMAN BEING FULLY ALIVE!

I simply want to share how much it meant to me to be a part of our Lent, Holy Week, and Easter observances and celebrations during March and April. Although I missed Annie be-

ing a part of the planning process as well as the events themselves, it was a true joy to share the moments with Caroline and Bruce. The eight days from Palm Sunday through Easter Day were particularly meaningful to me. The drama of the Liturgy of the Palms so quickly followed by our Lord's passion is always poignant. But what

followed was made possible by some extraordinary organization by Caroline and Bruce. The events of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, & the Saturday night Vigil of Easter were powerful to say the least...quite unforgettable.

I was truly impressed by the use of Harris Hall for Thursday and Saturday nights. As soon as I walked into the hall on Thursday, a mood was created for meaningful liturgy. The reading of the Passover story, the sharing of bread and wine at several tables, the reenactment of the foot washing, and then our moving into the church for the stripping of the altar seemed very real and special. The mood continued Friday in the church with the observance of our Lord's crucifixion in scripture, beautiful art, and extraordinary music. Entering Harris Hall in Saturday evening darkness prepared us for the lighting of the paschal candle for Easter services. We renewed our baptismal vows and were sprinkled with the waters of baptism before entering the dark church to hear the story of our Lord's resurrection and then experience instant light, organ fanfare, and the first Eucharist of Easter.

Easter Day could not have been more joyful. The children and youth choirs offered joyful song at 8:00 and the adult choir at 10:30. The community was full of joy and ready to celebrate the great Easter proclamation— "ALLELUIA! CHRIST IS RISEN! THE LORD IS RISEN INDEED! ALLELUIA!"

As I look forward to what lies ahead, I can't help looking back to what we as a Christian community shared at Christ Church and how many people contributed. Caroline thanked us all on Easter Day, so I now proclaim our thanks to Caroline who blessed us with wonderful scripts for the Holy Week liturgies and wonderful checklists to remember all the details. Most of all, she did this with her genuine patience and calm presence.

But we did not just observe and reenact. Somehow as I walked this walk from Palm Sunday through Easter Day, I came to appreciate that I truly was created in the image of God and that I still need to "repent and return." Most of all, however, I came to renew with a deeper understanding how much God loves me unconditionally, not as someone who is perfect but as someone who is good enough to make a difference in this world. One of New Hampshire's nominees for Bishop quoted the great early church father, Irenaeus, who once suggested that "the best evidence for the resurrection is a human being fully alive."

After walking the walk in the wonderful community of faith that you and I call Christ Church, Snookie and I returned to Manchester on Easter Day feeling fully alive!

Safe church training provides education for the prevention of child abuse, exploitation, and harassment. This class is offered to those who need "initial training," but also to anyone needing a "refresher" program.



RECTOR SEARCH PROCESS UPDATE

In last month's article on the Search Committee's progress, we were looking forward to hearing from The Rev Tim Rich, Canon to the Ordinary for the Diocese of New Hampshire, after he returned from the Transitional Ministry Conference in Florida where he presented Christ Church to other diocesan deployment officers.

David and Carol met with Tim on April 5th. He gave us names of potential candidates for rector of Christ Church. These names are a combination of those received from the conference and locally from the Diocese.

The committee's next step is to practice a Skype interview with a clergy person who is not a candidate. We hope this will help us improve our interviewing skills and smooth out any technology problems.

Before our meeting on April 18th we all will have reviewed the resumes of the candidates. The next step is for the whole committee to discuss all the resumes and decide whom we wish to interview via Skype.

Obviously, this will be a lengthy discussion and may take a couple of meetings. However, we plan to begin interviewing the outstanding candidates as soon as possible.

This phase of the search is important and time consuming for all the members. It is also the beginning of our "radio silence"! We will be working hard, but not at liberty to discuss our progress.

We continue to rely on your support and prayers in the process. We are blessed to have a dedicated and talented committee working on your behalf.



MEMORIAL DAY MEMORY

On Memorial Day, 1963, we left three children at home to watch the parade and went to the hospital to have our fourth child. Following a long labor I was delivered a full term stillborn boy. Death was due to Rh blood incompatibility. Due to medical practices of the times, I did not see or hold him. I was still in the hospital when the graveside service was held and never felt any sense of resolution, only the devastating loss. I became a donor for a vaccine to prevent such losses, and five years later had another son, thanks to new intrauterine transfusions. He is 44 today and father of his own child. I wrote this poem two years ago out of a need for closure.

O son, I never held you nor saw your tiny face. Your life slipped silently away before that first embrace.

The little child I never knew these forty-seven years
The memory of that pain endures and brings forgotten tears.

Your breathing stopped mere days before that bright Memorial morn. Our hopes and dreams were shattered on the day that you were born.

There should have been a moment we could hold our baby boy to tell him he was loved and safe And promise life and joy.

I must believe his spirit lives in some peaceful loving place. I hope he knows I loved him, though I never saw his face.
